CURRENT STATUS AS OF MAY 15, 2021

Baltimore, MD will open in stages based on the critical public health metrics and guidelines as outlined by the order of the Governor of the State of Maryland. This staged approach focuses on community-based guidelines, sector-based guidance and clear communication.

## DESTINATION DETAILS

The State of Maryland is currently under a limited travel advisory:

- Quarantine requirements and other restrictions on out-of-state travel have been lifted.
- Marylanders will continue to be encouraged to get tested for COVID-19 upon their return from out-of-state travel.
- Maryland's statewide masking order remains in full force and effect. This requires the wearing of masks or face coverings at any public indoor facility, including retail establishments, fitness centers, grocery stores, pharmacies, personal service establishments, in the public spaces of all public and private businesses across the state, and when using public transportation. Masks are still required in all outdoor public areas whenever it is not possible to maintain physical distancing.
