










SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA

Southern California will open in stages as outlined in the state of California's "Resilience Roadmap." This staged approach focuses on community-based guidelines, sector-based guidance and clear communication.

AIRPORT OPERATIONS

Airport operations are currently at 50%. Face coverings at Los Angeles International Airport and John Wayne Airport are required. Health entry screenings may be required based on country or region of origin.

Some airport shops and restaurants are open with reduced hours and food service only for grab-and-go and orders.



DESTINATION DETAILS

Stage 2 expansion will happen gradually with some communities moving through stage 2 faster due to greater progress. Counties that have met the readiness criteria and worked with the California Department of Public Health can open workplaces earlier than is outlined in the state's "Resilience Roadmap."
